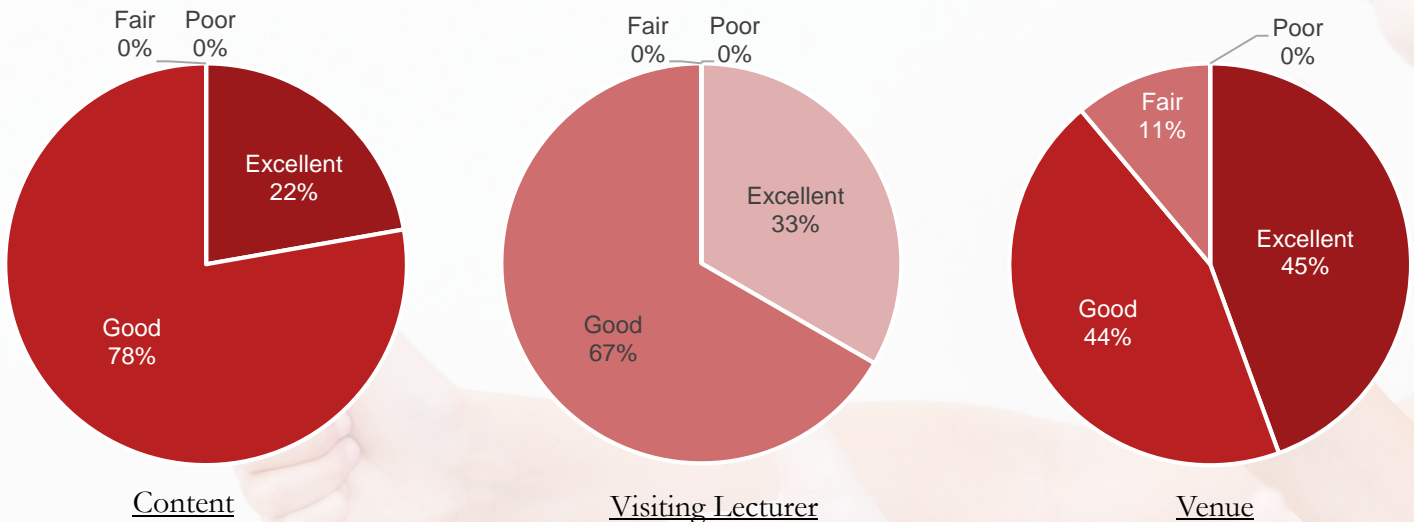


Seminar on “Essentials of Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Ordinance for Construction Professionals”

Successfully Held on 6 January 2017



The Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Ordinance (Cap 623) changes the fundamental landscape of rights of third parties in contractual settings such as warranties, guarantees and all transactions that expressly or impliedly conferring rights over third parties in the standard forms of contracts commonly in use in the construction industry in Hong Kong.

With such far-reaching reform to the doctrine of ‘privity of contract’, the Ordinance has been in force this year and its implications to the construction industry are taken shape in affecting daily operation. It is now vital to know and safeguard who is and who is not able to enforce and derive a benefit from a contract entered into by others.
